#### **School Principles for PE and Sport Premium Grant Spend**

At River View, we ensure that teaching and learning opportunities in PE are high quality, meeting the needs of all pupils so they may achieve their potential.

We provide a broad PE curriculum.

Sport Premium funding is allocated and targeted based on needs analysis which identifies priority classes, groups or individuals who will benefit from intervention in PE and Sport. Limited funding and resources means that not all children will be in receipt of sport premium interventions at one time.

#### **Summary of spending and actions to be taken:**

- 1. Target least active pupils across the school and develop extra activities promote a healthier lifestyle and tackle obesity**
- 2. Continue partnerships with local sports clubs including wrestling, Swinton Lions Ruby League and gymnastics group**
- 3. Invest in a range of equipment to support teaching and learning in PE and engage all pupils**
- 4. Develop staff expertise in planning, delivery and assessment for PE**
- 5. Continue CPD for staff**

- 5. PE staff are more highly skilled to deliver effective PE provision**
